Implement Lead Rule Revision

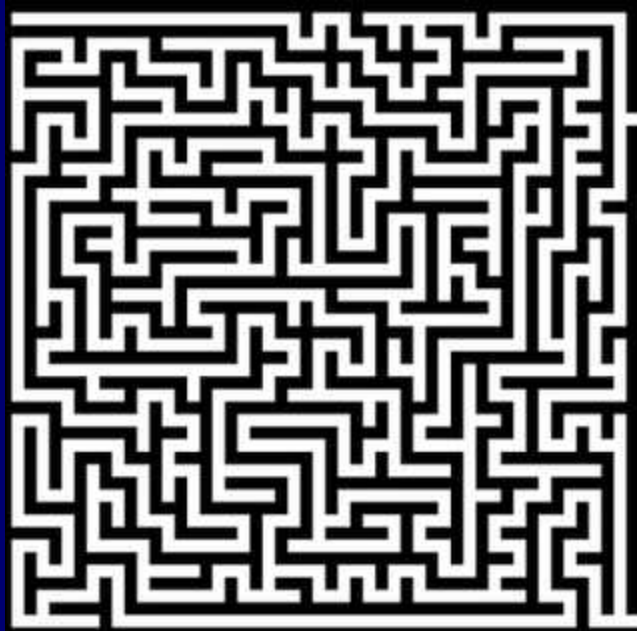
- EPA Renovation and Repair Rule (RRP)

EPA/HUD Disclosure

Requires the disclosure of known information on lead-based paint and lead-based paint hazards before the sale or lease of most housing built before 1978

- Clearance testing
- Recordkeeping

MPCA Regulations

- Steel Structures - Inspection, notification and work practice requirements
- Waste disposal - Residential and Commercial

OSHA Regulations

- Exposure Monitoring
- Medical Monitoring/Medical Removal
- Training
- Compliance Program
- Respiratory Protection
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Hygiene and Housekeeping

Local/Municipal Regulations

Certain local regulations may order work which may impact lead.

- Property Inspection
- Rental Code Compliance

MDH Rule Adoption Process

- Conduct a regulatory review of all current regulations
- Solicit comment from concerned parties
- Work with other regulatory agencies
- Draft a new regulation
